

PULPIT ANNOUNCEMENTS
Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time
October 10/11, 2020

1. The current schedule of Masses in the church is Saturday 5:15pm, Sunday 6:30am, 7:45am, 9:00am, 10:15am, Noon, 1:45 Spanish Mass and 5:15pm. Weekday Masses are 8:15am and 5:30pm. The attendance at all weekend Masses will continue to be closely monitored in order to accommodate all parishioners wishing to attend in-person services if at all possible. We will strive to give a minimum of one week's notice of any Mass time changes or additional Masses.
2. Last weekend, we did not turn anyone away from Mass due to exceeding our 100-person limit. However, the 10:15 and both evening Masses were at full capacity. If you have the flexibility, you are encouraged to consider attending the 7:45, 9am or Noon Masses so that we can continue to make room for other parishioners who may not have that flexibility. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.
3. As previously announced in our parish bulletin and website, a parish membership to FORMED has been purchased as a Jubilee gift to all of us.
